

Veteran education benefits

The Post 9/11 GI Bill

- Veterans and dependents who had the benefit transferred to them from their veteran parent
- > Pays in-state tuition and fees at public institutions
- ➤ Monthly housing allowance \$1716/month
- Annual Book Stipend \$1000

Dependents Educational Assistant Program

- ➤ Dependents of veteran who are 100% totally and permanently service-connected disabled or service-connected deceased
- ➤ Benefit: \$1021/month

Reserve GI Bill

- Reservists currently serving in the reserves.
- > Benefit: \$368/month

Academic Plan Form

- VA requires all students receiving federal educational benefits to have an approved Academic Plan Form on file.
- Only courses that are required for a student's degree and/ or graduation requirement can be certified to VA.
- APF must be filled out with courses for all three quarters and signed by an academic advisor (not a student peer advisor). Elective or Psy-xx is not accepted courses.
- APF must be updated quarterly if courses change and signed/dated again by an academic advisor.


REPEATING COURSES


- Classes that are successfully completed may not be certified for again for VA purposes if they are repeated.
- If a student fails a class, or if a program requires a higher grade than the one achieved in a particular class for successful completion, that course class may be repeated and certified to VA again.
- Example 1, if a Nursing program requires a "B" or better in Biology, then that class may be repeated if a "B" or better was not earned.
- Example 2. If a student chooses to repeat a course that was successfully completed, just to improve their GPA, that course cannot be certified to VA.


