# Advising for Equity Advisory Committee

Kayton Carter

- New advisory committee launched in August
- Committee made up of staff, students, and faculty
- Intersection of undergraduate, graduate, curricular, and co-curricular
- Charged to identify behavioral, structural, and policy-related barriers in advising and recommend changes center equity
- Direct tie to the Chancellor

# 2021 UCDAAC

Kayton Carter

- Breakout groups provided feedback to prompts, such as:
  - How to facilitate inclusion on campus
  - Identifying contextual factors and systemic barriers that undermine success of our students
  - How personal identities play into advising and how to reduce harm
- Themes included:
  - Our community (students, staff, faculty): admissions, outreach, recruitment, representation, hiring, training, retention, communication, community-building, tutoring, programming, accessibility, wellness, belonging, etc.
  - Intentionality & inclusivity: language, workshops, decentering whiteness (curriculum and beyond), examine definition of success, policy reflective of Principles of Community, etc.
- Next steps:
  - Updates to trainings; how to capture faculty
  - Provide ongoing learning opportunities related to equity
  - Advising for Equity Advisory Committee recommendations to Chancellor for decisions at a campus-level or outside of our scope (i.e., admissions, faculty training, etc.)

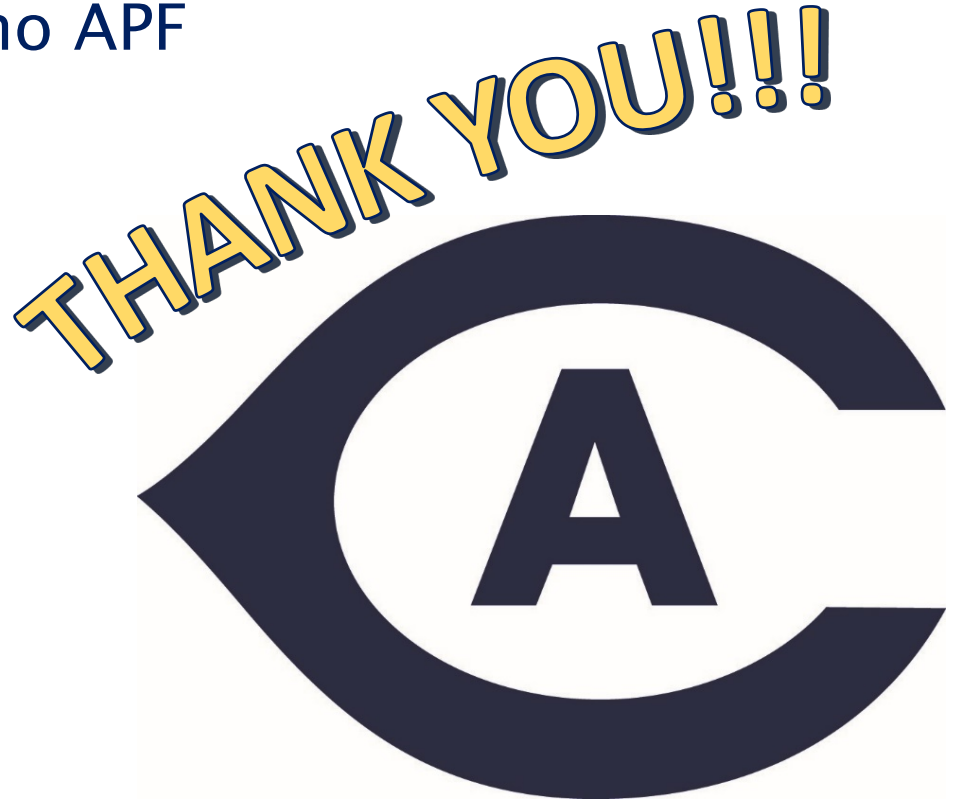

- Due Friday, November 12<sup>th</sup>
    - Ineligible on Monday, November 15<sup>th</sup>, if no APF
  - Using OASIS forms
    - Usually labelled 2021-22 APF (or similar)
  - Who can approve APF?
  - What are rules for YOUR office?
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- ✓ Intent to Declare Form
  - ✓ Transfer course equivalencies
